CURRENT SITUATION

The number of confirmed cases in Ivory has increased to 25 after 8 new cases were recorded in 22.03.2020. New cases include;

- a man and a woman of French nationality, aged 36 years each, who returned from France on March 15, 2020
- a 40-year old Ivorian female who returned from France mid-March
- 2 Lebanese men aged 49 and 38 who returned from France within the last 14 days.

Prime Minister is currently under self-isolation

Government restrictions into force:

- Access to passenger terminals is now limited only to travellers and staff working at the airport.
- Public and users of the Félix Houphouët-Boigny International
 Airport in Abidjan that the escort and reception of travellers are prohibited in terminals until further notice.
- Non-entry for travellers from countries with 100 + confirmed cases for the next 15 renewable days.
- Ban on gatherings of more than 50 people
- Transport regulations introduced—vehicles with 5 seats can only take 2 driver passengers, and those with 7 seats, 4 passengers
- Closure of all borders with effect from 22.03.2020 (midnight).
- Imposition of curfew from 9pm to 5am local time with effect from 24.03.2020.

PREPAREDNESS

Similar to it neighbouring states, any escalation of the contagion would strain the existing infrastructure as the deficit in key logistical, health and other key facilities is acute and will exacerbate an already fragile situation. Treichville University Hospital in Abidjan has been designated to treat patients.
