



## COVID-19 UPDATE

### TOGO

**Confirmed Cases:** 199  
**Death:** 11  
**Recovered:** 92



### CURRENT SITUATION

Confirmed cases have increased to 199 with 11 deaths and 92 recoveries. Lomé has recorded the majority of cases. Curfew restrictions in the Grand Lomé region have revised from 9 PM to 5 AM, while working hours were changed to 8 AM-4 PM (effective on May 11). Random large-scale testing is expected to begin in the next 7 to 14 days. 11,041 tests have been completed. Government also prepares to issue its social bonds this week. Air France flights into Lomé is expected on 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> June.



### IVORY COAST

**Confirmed Cases:** 1857  
**Death:** 21  
**Recovered:** 820



### CURRENT SITUATION

Number of confirmed cases is at 1857. 11,448 tests have been completed. The epicentre Abidjan has now recorded over 1000 cases<sup>1</sup>. Fatalities and recoveries have reached 21(1.1%) and 820 (44.1%) respectively. General curfews have been lifted since 8<sup>th</sup> May however curfew has been maintained in Greater Abidjan<sup>2</sup>. Educational activities have also resumed. Ban on restaurants and other entertainment centres have been lifted. Limit of the people for official gathering has been increased from 50 to 200 in Abidjan. Government has also repatriated Ivoirians from Senegal, Benin and Mali.

## SENEGAL

**Confirmed Cases:** 1995  
**Death:** 19  
**Recovered:** 742



### CURRENT SITUATION

Confirmed cases in Senegal has increased to 1995 in the last 7 days. Death and recoveries have also increased to 19 (0.95%) and 742(37.1%) respectively. Total tests completed increased to 18,969. The government has eased up curfew and restriction measures<sup>3</sup>. Some school activities are expected to resume on 2nd June. Places of worship have also been reopened with strict safety measures. 10 million masks are expected to be distributed to the public this week. Arrangement for the repatriation of Senelgese abroad has started.

## BURKINA FASO

**Confirmed Cases:** 766  
**Death:** 51  
**Recovered:** 588



### CURRENT SITUATION

Burkina Faso has now recorded 766 C-19 cases. 51 deaths and 588 recoveries have also been recorded taking fatality rate and recovery rate to 6.6% and 76.7% respectively. Ouagadougou remains the epicentre of the pandemic<sup>4</sup>. The Prime Minister has formed a new national management committee for the pandemic after the dissolution of the first committee. Ban on school and other educational activities have been extended to June 1<sup>st</sup>. Disinfection of homes in the Tabtenga District. It is estimated that BF has 306b FCTA in tax revenue shortfall as a result of the pandemic.

## BENIN

**Confirmed Cases:** 327  
**Death:** 2  
**Recovered:** 76



### CURRENT SITUATION

Total of confirmed C-19 cases has increased to 327. Number of deaths and recoveries stand at 2 and 76 respectively. Restrictions have been eased up as educational activities have resumed in some areas. Suspension of judicial hearings has been lifted. Safety measures are still encouraged as the mandatory wearing of masks are still enforced.
