

COVID-19 UPDATE

TOGO

Confirmed Cases: 1,513

Death: 34

Recovered: 1,112



CURRENT SITUATION

Togo's case count has increased to 1,513 following 204 new cases over the last 2 weeks. 19 people (7 new deaths) have died while 673 patients (193 new recoveries) have fully recovered. 72,554 tests have so far been completed. Activities are returning to normal as the government has eased the majority of the management restrictions. Schools, businesses and public transport services have all resumed operations under strict health and safety protocols. The extended state of emergency is expected to end on September 15th.Operations at the Gnassingbe Enyadema Airport has also resumed but passengers are required to pass C-19 clearance before entry.



IVORY COAST

Confirmed Cases: 18,778

Death: 119

Recovered: 17,688



CURRENT SITUATION

The case count in Ivory Coast is at 18,778 (1,216 new cases in 14 days). The number of deaths and recoveries have increased to 119 and 17,688 respectively. 135,277 tests have been completed nationwide with a positivity rate of 13.8%. Anti-government protests held few weeks ago contributed to the few infections in the last 2 weeks. Daily activities are gradually getting to normal as the government has eased several restrictions. Airports have resumed operations and testing before arrival is compulsory for all travellers. As the country prepares



for general elections in October, more restrictions are expected to be eased.

SENEGAL

Confirmed Cases: 14,102

Death: 293

Recovered: 10,176



CURRENT SITUATION

Senegal has recorded 916 new cases over the past 2 weeks taking the total number of C-19 cases to 14,102. Death toll and recoveries stand at 293(2.07%) and 10,176 (72.1%) respectively. Current positivity rate is 9.1% following 154,258 tests. The increase in numbers could be attributed to easing up of restrictions and non-compliance to safety protocols. Senegal has also opened airspace and resumed airport operations. Travellers are however expected to provide various documents with a negative C-19 test certificate before entry is granted.



BURKINA FASO

Confirmed Cases: 1,466

Death: 56

Recovered 1,112



CURRENT SITUATION

Confirmed cases are currently at 1,466 as 108 new cases have been recorded over the past 2 weeks. The number of deaths is at 56 (3.8%) while recoveries have increased to 1,112 (75.8%). The situation continues to impact business in food and agriculture as poor sales figures suggest restricted spending from households and logistical bottlenecks hinder producers. Community transmissions continue to be recorded in Ouagadougou, Bobo-Dioulasso, Gaoua, and Boromo over the



past 2 weeks. The government continues to emphasize adhering to public health safety protocols.

BENIN

Confirmed Cases: 2,213

Death: 40

Recovered: 1,793



CURRENT SITUATION

Confirmed C-19 cases have increased to 2,213 over the last two weeks—98 new cases. Number of deaths is at 40 with 1 recorded over the period while recoveries recorded at 1,793 (81%). 131,073 tests have been conducted with a 1.69% positivity rate. Government directives on health compliance amongst the public remain in force.
